Dear Friends and Family of Saint Lucas:

For this newsletter, I was intending to write about the changing seasons and how even the colors of Fall can serve to remind us how the transition from this life-to-life everlasting with our Lord can be beautiful and awe-inspiring.

But the news in September of the untimely and horrible passing of Charlie Kirk left me feeling hollow and beyond sad. Putting all politics aside (how I wish we could do that) it seems apparent that Charlie was a man who put God (in Christ) first, his family second, and his country third. And he always put each of those three above his own good and welfare.

Charlie left a loving wife and two young children behind to mourn his loss. And even at the point of his death, there were those who derided his mission to share the love of God and the love of country with all who would speak with him. Charlie has been falsely cast as spewing hatred and division, which was so directly opposite of the truth about Charlie: that he was willing to listen to everyone, and to honestly debate anyone with respect, at the same time sharing his relationship with Christ as his Lord and Savior.

Let me repeat and be clear. This is not about politics. It's not about "which side you're on" or whether you vote Democrat or Republican or Independent. This is about the death of a good man. Not good on his own merits or works, but good because of the blood of Jesus Christ.

Saint Paul writes in Philippians 1:20-23:

"As it is my eager expectation and hope that I will not be at all ashamed, but that with full courage now as always Christ will be honored in my body, whether by life or by death. For to me to live is Christ, and to die is gain. If I am to live in the flesh, that means fruitful labor for me. Yet which I shall choose I cannot tell. I am hard pressed between the two. My desire is to depart and be with Christ, for that is far better."

Charlie Kirk's desire has been fulfilled, not in his own time or by his own hand. But I take solace that our Lord has also spoken lovingly to him "today you will be with Me in paradise."

May God grant each of us such a blessed end and new beginning.
